Danubius University promotes knowledge and innovation by offering a unique experience of learning, research and development, regardless of age, experience, level of knowledge or form of training of students.

Danubius University was founded in 1992 by Prof. univ. dr. Benone Pusca. It was certified in 2008 as a research-development institution and was placed 5th in Romania among the universities certified as research-development units, according to the ANCS decision of July 2008. All these were prerequisites for the prestige of our institution to increase from one year to the next, proof that since 2005 "Danubius" grants the title of "DOCTOR HONORIS CAUSA".

Based on the "non-profit" principle, the "Danubius" University in Galati operates in accordance with the Constitution and the laws governing Romanian higher education, proposing to train specialists at the level of contemporary knowledge and performance, to promote forms and methods of education in line with the progress of today's society, but also with human rights and freedoms.

Currently, the student campus consists of 3 buildings. The Faculty of Economic Sciences and Business Administration (FSEAA) has been accredited since 2004, undertaking the mission of training specialists, researchers and leaders in the bachelor and master's fields of Business Administration, Finance and Accounting.



Currently, the Faculty of Economic Sciences and Business Administration manages the following undergraduate programs:

Finance field, study program: Finance and Banks (IF form of education); Business Administration field, study program: Economy of trade, tourism and services (IF and ID forms of education);

Accounting field, study program: Accounting and management informatics (IF and FR forms of education).

All degree programs are accredited.

Added to these are the accredited Public and Private Financial Management and Fintech master's degree programs in the field of Finance and Audit and Public and Private Control in the field of Accounting.

The key elements governing the management strategy of the Faculty of Economic Sciences and Business Administration are: performance, transparency, team, communication, legality.

THE SPEECH OF THE DEAN OF THE SCHOOL OF BEHAVIORAL AND APPLIED SCIENCES

In accordance with Romanian legislation, the Department for Teaching Staff Training is a structure of Danubius University authorized to offer psychopedagogical training programs for the exercise of the teaching profession, both for university students and for holders of bachelor's or master's degrees in the university's specific fields. The department also offers continuous training programs (Development of professional skills in the field of special education), professional conversion for pre-university teachers or postgraduate training and continuous professional development programs (Educational Management, Digital Teaching in the Virtual Classroom).



THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE TRAINING OF TEACHING PERSONNEL

The Department for the Training of Teaching Personnel (DPPD) is a specialized department with a psycho-pedagogical profile qualified to offer psycho-pedagogical training programs to exercise the teaching profession in preuniversity and university education.



The psychopedagogical and didactic training is carried out by the educational plans established at the national level, by order of the minister, and is structured on two levels:

- The psycho-pedagogical training program level I (initial) can be followed during the undergraduate studies, but only starting from the first year of a faculty within the Danubius University, in the specialization to which he was admitted.
- Danubius University educates postgraduates, for the level I (initial) psychopedagogical training module, only graduates of university degree programs with specializations existing at our university or compatible with them: Economics of Tourism Trade and Services, Finance and Banks, Accounting and Management Informatics, Informatics, Law, Communication and Public Relations, International Relations and European Studies, Psychology, Social Work.
- The level II (in-depth) psycho-pedagogical training program can be followed during the master's studies, but only starting from the first year, in the program/specialization to which he was admitted and if he had a certificate of completion of the level I (initial) psycho-pedagogical module and are graduates of undergraduate studies in a major/graduate study program in the same field as the field of the master's program in which they are a student.
- Also, DPPD educates postgraduates for the level II (in-depth) psychopedagogical training module, graduates who have a certificate of completion of the level I (initial) module, who are graduates of bachelor's and master's studies, both in the same field and existing/accredited within our institution, i.e. from the fields of Law, Finance, Business Administration, Accounting, Communication Sciences, International Relations and European Studies, Psychology, Computer Science, Social Work or interdisciplinary if applicable, among them.



DANUBIUS COLLEGE

DANUBIUS non-university tertiary College is a school that operates under the umbrella of Danubius University, already appreciated by students, parents and the local community for:

- the efficiency of the instructive educational activity;
- ensuring equal opportunities for education for all students;
- the material basis necessary for a quality education.

High school graduates with and without a baccalaureate diploma are admitted to study. The non-university tertiary College DANUBIUS offers educational services in two fields of training, for three qualifications.

The fields of training are:

Media Production Field

CAMERAMAN PHOTOREPORTER qualification,
ISCED level 5

The graduate of the Cameraman Photoreporter qualification will be able to:

- Use professional and broadcast cameras, both on set and in the field, in recorded or live productions
- Know the techniques and technologies that are necessary for creating TV productions
- Possesses the necessary qualities for teamwork and assuming responsibilities in the activity: Direction – Image – Scenography

Graduates of Cameraman Photoreporter qualification will be able to work, according to the Romanian occupation classification code, as IT and communications technicians; telecommunications, broadcasting and television technicians; photojournalists; journalists. The practical courses are held in the TV studio of Danubius University, and the teachers are practitioners, specialists in the field of media. Duration of studies: 2 years

Informatics Field

ANALYST PROGRAMMER qualification, ISCED level 5

The graduate of the Programmer Analyst qualification will be able to: Use information and communication technologies for the conception, design, development, testing, implementation and development of information systems, programs and related technical documentation.

Graduates of Analyst Programmer qualification will be able to work, according to the Romanian occupation classification code, as programmer analysts, information and communication technology specialists, computer science consultants.

Duration of studies: 1.5 years



LOCAL NETWORKS AND COMMUNICATIONS ADMINISTRATOR qualification, ISCED level 5

The graduate of the Local Networks and Communications Administrator qualification will be able to:

- use computer network equipment;
- know and use network protocols and terminologies;
- know and apply local network (LAN) and global network (WAN) topologies, OSI (Open System Interconnection) reference models;
- to use cables, tools for structured cabling, routers, in accordance with the standards in force;
- install and configure network operating systems.

Graduates of Local Networks and Communications Administrator qualification will be able to work, according to the Romanian occupation classification code, as specialists in information and communication technology; database and network specialists; specialists in information and communication technology.

Duration of studies: 1.5 years

Practical courses are held in laboratories equipped with state-of-the-art equipment, and the teachers are practitioners, specialists in the IT field.

Specialized practice is provided both inside and outside the Danubius College, at specialized partner companies.

At the end of the years of study, students from all qualifications will take the professional skills certification exam to obtain the specialist diploma in the graduated field.

Diplomas obtained after completing the studies at the Danubius College are recognized throughout Europe.

At Danubius College we create specialists for the most sought-after jobs of the moment.

LSUD is an apolitical and non-governmental association and brings together members from all Schools of Danubius University, regardless of their year of study.




- Promoting the general and specific interests of its members in all fields of activity and developing specific programs in the field of information, training and education of students;

- Organizing actions with a professional-scientific, cultural, sports, tourist or other specific activities;


















SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH

The Laboratory of Experimental Psychology is designed to carry out practical activities for students enrolled in Psychology within the School of Behavioral and Applied Sciences.

INFORMATICS AND PSYCHODIAGNOSIS LABORATORY

The Laboratory of Informatics and Psycho-diagnosis is for the practical and seminar activities of the students from the Psychology specialty, within the School of Behavioral and Applied Sciences. The trainees participate in practical activities aimed at initiating the following steps: investigating and psychodiagnosis of the disorders, psychological evaluation of the mental health state for carrying out psychological examination activities, cognitive and neuropsychological assessment, behavioral evaluation, subjective-emotional evaluation.

The lab is equipped with:

- The MAB Manual;
- Online point for managing / scoring MAB;
- Verbal Skills Testing Book for MAB;
- Performance test kit for MAB;
- · Response sheet for MAB;

THE FORENSIC LABORATORY

The Forensic Laboratory, the main attraction of future forensic experts, offers the opportunity to use state-of-the-art equipment to analyze the forensic investigation of the crime scene. The strength of this laboratory is the manikin made of a special material that allows students to carry out the investigation by successive maneuvers involving punching, cutting, snatching in order to determine the objects that lead to bodily injury.

Within this lab, future lawyers carry out practical activities alongside specialists from the Forensic Services. We exemplify in this sense the practical activity of investigating the crime, and in particular on-the-spot investigation, activity performed within the discipline of Forensics - Investigation Techniques and Procedures.

The Judicial Clinic Laboratory is a space set up as a courtroom where students are involved in simulated trials so as to deal with the diversity of issues raised by the complexity of a trial.

The Judicial Clinic Discipline is studied in the IVth year of studies and the general objective of this discipline is to prepare the students with thorough knowledge, at theoretical and especially practical level regarding the conduct of the criminal trial taking into account the procedure to be followed in front of the courts. Whatever role they play in a simulated trial, students' participation in such a project can only show their legal knowledge level, accumulated over their years of study, to help them discover whether they are fit to plead or if they can do well in the robe of a judge or a prosecutor.

Within MEDIA department there is a television studio equipped with modern equipment, acquired through the VEHMED (Media Vehicles for Practical Skills Training, Television and News conducted by Students for students) and M.E.D.I.I.A. (M.E.D.I.I.A - Educational Methods for the Development of Innovative Entrepreneurial Education) projects.

VEHMED is a project co-financed by the European Social Fund through the Sectoral Operational Program Human Resources Development 2007-2013, Priority Axis 2 – "Linking lifelong learning to the labor market", Key area of intervention: 2.1 – "Transition from school to active life", Reference number for the grant contract POSDRU 90 non-/2.1./S/64002 (www.vehmed.ro).

M.E.D.I.I.A. was a project based on the needs of innovation. Innovation and sustainability are the two principles on which the partnership has developed the project's specific objectives and activities. The need for innovation is, first of all, related to innovation as a necessity in the development of companies. To achieve this general objective, the partnership aims to:

- Revising its own educational offer and increasing the attractiveness and practical dimension of educational offers;

1. Justification. Vision and mission


- · philosophical hermeneutics;

RESEARCH CENTER ON SOCIO-ECONOMIC DYNAMICS IN SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

Being a continuation of the Multidisciplinary Research Center, established in 2001, the Research Center on Socio-Economic Dynamics in Sustainable Development (CC-DISEDD) was created in 2008, in order to contribute, support, develop and promote: Research Fundamental and applied scientific, innovation, transfer of



knowledge, development of human resources involved in research and enhancing research. In a knowledge-based society, characterized by four verbs of action (to generate, to transmit, to broadcast and to use), the Center for Research on Socio-economic dynamics in sustainable development implies the development of a new organizational culture based on reality and in particular the generation of surplus values.

Sustainable development results in the establishment of a new development paradigm through the confluence of economic, social and environmental factors. Science must be viewed as an essential component in the process of restructuring the society and the economy to ensure sustainable development. The objectives for sustainable development (ODD) recognize that the eradication of pauperity is the key to strategies that build economic development. Eradication of pauperity and economic and social development are essential for sustainable development. Increased access to productive resources and the existence of effective public institutions are the most important in the fight against pauperity. Public and private investments in education, health and social programs are indispensable, to give the poor the means of integration in the market economy and to contribute to an economic development for the benefit of all.

In the Universal Declaration of Human Rights it was stated: "Everyone has the right to a decent level of life, able to ensure his health, his well-being and his family, especially food, clothing, house, as well as the necessary social services." However, these rights remain virtual for many inhabitants of the planet. In the last 10 years, 1% of the world's population has captured more than half of the new global richness (according to the Survival report The Richest published by Oxfam, 2022), why it has been installed and what is the way of eradication are essential questions, for which we should seek and find answers, formulate and apply effective and close strategies to the socio-economic development characteristic of each country. We must resort to collecting all data useful to understand the cultural, social, economic, political and institutional realities that

determine the opportunities and obstacles encountered by the poor I, in their efforts to escape from the "trap of pauperity". ODD addresses a palette of social needs that include education, health, social protection and opportunities for places work, while treating climatic changes and environmental protection. Looking at the prism of a challenge, but also a real development opportunity, CC-DISEDD focuses on coagulating national and international research efforts on the influence of legislative and economic stability in social life, as well as the influence of economic, social and legislative factors on sustainable development, by orienting the entire educational process, of scientific research and innovation towards this requirement.

In order to explore the concepts, strategies, sustainable development indicators, social responsibility, to develop interest, skills and education in this field CC-DISEDD intensifies the stimulation of the potential and capacity of research groups in the university environment-teachers, students and masters., as well as the institutional and private environment, by: connecting them to priority research programs at national and international level; dissemination of research results by participating in internal and international scientific events, in order to make their own research areas and results; materializing the results of the research by publishing them in prestigious publishers in the country and abroad; Developing and diversifying collaborations with other similar research centers or educational institutions in the country and abroad.

The Center for Research on Socio-economic dynamics in sustainable development is involved in strategic partnerships with the regional economic environment, being invited as a credible partner and expert in the debates for the Sustainable Development Council of the Galati Council and of the Southeast Regional Development Agency. FOREIGN LANGUAGE COURSES - **ENGLISH, ITALIAN, SPANISH, ROMANIAN, FRENCH** - are carried out to acquire an available language (for Linguistic Competence or International Certificates), but also on request for specialized language: business, financial-banking, academic, technical, legal, administrative, medical, touristic, journalistic. The courses are completed with the issuance of a certificate of participation issued by the Danubius University in Galati or with the passing of an exam to obtain a certificate of linguistic competence - level A1/A2, B1/B2, C1/C2 issued by ECL (European Consortium for the Certificate of Attainment in Modern Languages) - which can be used for Ph.D. enrollment, employment, professional promotion, scholarship etc.

APPLICATION FILE

The application file will include the following documents:

- a) The request for issuing the letter of acceptance to study, according to the Methodology for offering of studies and training to foreign citizens in EU third countries in public and private education accredited in Romania, completed at all fields in duplicate;
- b) The Baccalaureate diploma or its equivalent– copy and legally certified translation;
- c) The studies document copy and legally certified translation which allows the access of the candidate to the respective education program (bachelor's degree diploma or its equivalent);
- d) Academic records copy and legally certified translation for the completed studies;
- e) Birth certificate copy and legally certified translation;
- f) Copy of the passport valid at least 6 months after the date when the letter of acceptance to studies is issued;
- g) Medical certificate (in a widespread international language) to prove that the person to be registered for studies does not suffer from infectious diseases or other illnesses that are incompatible with the future profession;
- h) Papers certifying the name change, copy and authorized translation (ex. Marriage certificate, etc.);



The candidates will send the files directly to the chosen accredited high education institutions. The high education institutions will analyze the files and send to the Ministry of National Education – General Department for International Relations, a list of persons that are nominated to receive the Letter of Acceptance to Studies. Along with the list, the high education institutions must send a copy of the applications for issuing the Letter of Acceptance to Studies that were filled in by the candidates.

When registering, the candidates will present the documents from the Application file, in original, certified for authentication by the Embassy of Romania to the issuer country or endorsed with the Hague apostille, if the previous studies were not completed in Romania, in a European Union country or in accordance with the legal assistance agreements signed between Romania and third countries. THE LIBRARY

The library of the Danubius University, a fundamental part of the academic offer, satisfies the need for knowledge and professional training of future specialists of the national and European economy through its equipment and environment. With a collection of more than 45,000 volumes consisting of books, collections of scientific journals, heritage books, the library is a valuable adjunct for future specialists in legal sciences, economics, international relations, administration and communication, including teachers find their source here main up-to-date scientific information.

The library's offer is not limited only to the profiles of existing specializations, the purchase of books and publications aiming at an encyclopedic approach. Dictionaries, encyclopedias, histories and other general works are made available to members of the academic community precisely to avoid a formative act limited to the field of study. The opening of the formative act to the fields related to the disciplines and to the general culture better highlights the personality of the specialist, whether he is a student or a teaching staff. The 8 hours of daily program are an essential part of the formative act in the academic offer. Based on the "non-profit" principle, the "Danubius" University in Galati operates in accordance with the Constitution and the laws governing Romanian higher education, proposing to train specialists at the level of contemporary knowledge and performance, to promote forms and methods of education in accordance with the progress of the current human society, but also with human rights and freedoms.



Modernity has imposed an organization of the book fund with particular emphasis on the latest acquisitions in each field of the sciences studied through the curricular approach. The offer does not lack the books of Danubius professors, the courses related to the subjects studied, the reference titles in each field, including an old book collection from donations, all accessible through the online computer system, so that no question remains unanswered, when a reader crosses the threshold of our library.

The library also offers access to Romanian and foreign databases. Through the Sintact and Indaco legislative databases Archived December 22, 2021, at the Wayback Machine., library users are connected to the latest legislative changes, jurisprudence and doctrine. It also offers access to 14 online journals in the fields of law and economics.

The Anelis Plus membership agreement of 2012, still in force, is of inestimable benefit to the library and the entire university. Through access to foreign databases, ProQuest Central and Cambridge Journals, the library has enriched its resources with more than 22690 materials available online, periodicals, dissertations, newspapers, reports, documents, video clips from various fields, accessible on the basis of institutional ip . Of these, 7060 specialized iournals of interest to the fields studied at our university were selected and listed. The resources are both in a foreign language, especially in English, and in Romanian. The online IT system (Tinread) offers the possibility of accessing information on library resources. When accessing the link, the Search option will change to Advanced Search, with the possibility of searching volumes according to title, author, subjects, year of publication, etc. After selecting a certain work, information such as title, author, publication details, ISBN, quota (by selecting the Professional option) and their availability in the library appear. At the same time, readers have the opportunity to enter into an online dialogue with librarians and receive additional information.

PUBLISHING HOUSE

In an environment of performance and creativity, Danubius University Press carries out its daily activity of valuing scientific research by disseminating its results: the 12 specialized journals (Danubius Journals & Danubius Proceedings), published books, partnerships with prestigious publishers in the country and abroad, being working tools available to members of the Danubian academic community. Danubius University Press (EUD) focused on providing course materials, publishing Danubius University's journals, processing them to meet the most demanding publishing standards, collaborating with foreign authors in order to disseminate the university's publications and events.

EUD offers:

- · a publishing contract;
- ISBN (international book identification code)
- access to the full text on the publisher's website (https://eud.univdanubius.ro/index.php/EUD) without login or costs;
- the format of the manuscript is established with the author (B5 or A5);
- the possibility to correct before the completion of the book (the manuscript must have at least two scientific referees);
- the cover is achieved according to the title, theme and wishes of the author;
- printing lasts about 10 working days, after the approval of the final content, the online version will be available the next day (with the author's consent);
- promoting the manuscript on all social networks of Danubius University, on the
 official website of the University, on the website of the Publishing House
 (https://eud.univ-danubius.ro/index.php/EUD) and in the network of
 institutional partners of Danubius University.
